

USSA Alpine Masters 2009 Skier's Edge Western Regional Championships Regional Champions Team (Group C)

The 2009 Western Region Championships were hosted by Intermountain division at Park City, UT on Feb. 5-8, 2009.

Tiebreaker Notes

There was 1 tie in the Group C classes at the 2009 Western Region Championships. Ties between competitors are decided by best result (best result, then next best, until broken; if finish records are equal in all races then race points are used as the final tiebreaker criteria).

W09 – tie between Marietta Frinell (FW) and Chris Liegl (CN) at 90 points.

Note: The race points formula was designed to normalize relative finish times onto a roughly equal scale independent of discipline, with the scale based at 0 points for the winner and points for other competitors computed relative to the winner's time. The lower the points, the closer to the winner's time.
